Making Basket Containers from Plant Leaves (newspaper also works)*

Materials needed: dry plant leaves that have fallen off in the home or collected by the city sewing thread or waxed linen thread, needles, scissors (we can discuss sizes as it varies) water source and a tub, sink or plastic bag in which to soak leaves old towels plastic bags

*It may be considered a good idea, for example, to make a container for the plastic bucket as some might prefer to contain the bucket, especially if it is recycled from previous use.

Composting in Your Kitchen and by Your Couch



Method 1: Vermiculture

Materials for each: 18 liter bucket with lid, red wiggler composting worms (Eisenia Fotida), coco coir or coco peat, printed label for top (I can send an example) and kitchen scraps



Method 2: Japanese cardboard box method

Materials: wood ash and coco coir or coco peat, cardboard box, garden scoop for stirring and a piece of cloth or kitchen cloth
